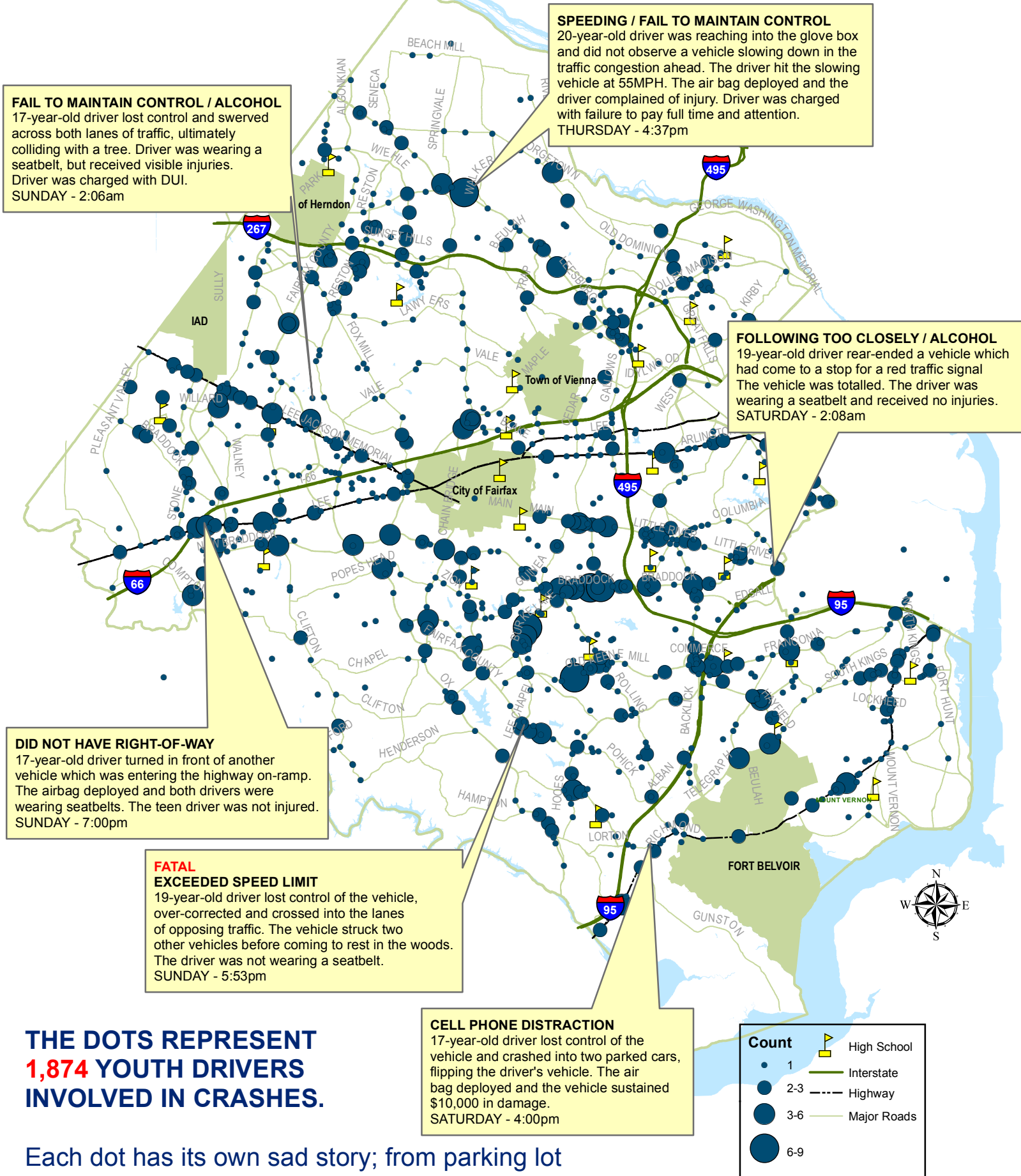


DON'T BECOME A DOT ON OUR MAP

YOUTH CRASH MAP

Drivers 15-20 Years of Age Involved in Reportable Crashes

Includes reportable crashes reported to the Fairfax County Police Department in 2015



FAIL TO MAINTAIN CONTROL / ALCOHOL
17-year-old driver lost control and swerved across both lanes of traffic, ultimately colliding with a tree. Driver was wearing a seatbelt, but received visible injuries. Driver was charged with DUI.
SUNDAY - 2:06am

SPEEDING / FAIL TO MAINTAIN CONTROL
20-year-old driver was reaching into the glove box and did not observe a vehicle slowing down in the traffic congestion ahead. The driver hit the slowing vehicle at 55MPH. The air bag deployed and the driver complained of injury. Driver was charged with failure to pay full time and attention.
THURSDAY - 4:37pm

FOLLOWING TOO CLOSELY / ALCOHOL
19-year-old driver rear-ended a vehicle which had come to a stop for a red traffic signal. The vehicle was totaled. The driver was wearing a seatbelt and received no injuries.
SATURDAY - 2:08am

DID NOT HAVE RIGHT-OF-WAY
17-year-old driver turned in front of another vehicle which was entering the highway on-ramp. The airbag deployed and both drivers were wearing seatbelts. The teen driver was not injured.
SUNDAY - 7:00pm

FATAL EXCEEDED SPEED LIMIT
19-year-old driver lost control of the vehicle, over-corrected and crossed into the lanes of opposing traffic. The vehicle struck two other vehicles before coming to rest in the woods. The driver was not wearing a seatbelt.
SUNDAY - 5:53pm

CELL PHONE DISTRACTION
17-year-old driver lost control of the vehicle and crashed into two parked cars, flipping the driver's vehicle. The air bag deployed and the vehicle sustained \$10,000 in damage.
SATURDAY - 4:00pm
